Today's Devotional – Take Heed Lest Ye Fall

If there's one thing we do in the summer it's weed. Just as everything starts to bloom, so do the weeds, and as any gardener knows you need to stay on top of them. If you don't you'll have a waist-high mess on your hands.

I expect to find weeds in my garden, I even expect them to crop up in the grass. What I don't expect so much are the few that take root in the concrete. How they manage to survive I'll never know, but somehow they do again and again.

Do you know what it is? It's the cracks—the perfect breeding ground for a seed. If left unchecked weeds have the potential to
